

Water & Woods Lapeer County Cub Scout Day Camp

Greetings Parent(s)/Guardian(s)!

We are really excited you chose to send your Scout(s) to the Water & Woods Lapeer County Cub Day Camp. This year's theme is **Galactic Trek!** We have lots of great things planned. We want your Scout(s) to get the most out of Day Camp this year, so we have planned lots of fun activities to give them the opportunity to have a great time while learning, earning awards and practicing Cub Scouting's 12 Core Values. Please take time to read through this letter. It contains helpful information about our camp.

- **Camp location: Camp Holaka 1789 Horton Lake Rd. Lapeer, MI 48446**
- **Check-in & Scout pick up will be located at the Dining Hall.**
- **The first day of camp (Wednesday, June 19th) check-in will start at 8:00am & end at 8:30am**
- **(Thursday, June 20th & Friday, June 21st) check-in will start at 8:45am & end at 9:00am**
- **Camp program will run from 9:00am - 4:00pm**
- To provide your Scout with the best program possible, Scouts will be assigned in dens of the same rank/age-for example: Tiger with Tigers... Webelos with Webelos, etc.
- The stations for the camp will be: Archery, B.B. Guns, Science, Water games, Scout Skills and Games (songs, skits & sport games).
- Each Cub Scout will receive an achievement sheet on the last day of day camp for the pins, belt loops and achievements they have completed at camp.
- Cub Scouts attend for the day (not overnight).
- **Lunch is NOT included; everyone (Scouts, walkers & staff) will need to bring a sack lunch.** There will be coolers available to store your sack lunches.
- **Please put your Scout's name on his lunch sack. Food is not provided, only water at every station. Please bring a water bottle.**
- Any registered Tiger Cub, Cub Scout or Webelos Scout may attend. New Tiger Cub Scouts entering the first grade in the fall (or 7-yrs-old) must have an Adult Partner with them at all time

Your Cub Scout should bring the following items with him to day camp: sunscreen, swimwear, towel, change of clothes, bag for wet clothes, bug repellent, water bottle, sack lunch, an extra pair of closed-toed shoes, rain gear, money to spend at the trading post and **completed** parts A & B of the Annual Health & Medical Record for your Scout **and for yourself** (if you plan on staying). The Health Officer will ask for them during check-in.

- Enclosed are parts A & B of the Annual Health and Medical Record and a map of camp
- Scout(s) are required to wear closed-toed shoes (no sandals or flip-flops please)!
- Please **DO NOT** bring pocket knives, valuables, or electronic equipment (games, phones, iPods, etc).
